A number of our BRAGS positions will be coming up for election by the end of this year. Now is the time to begin thinking about what you might want to take on, and to begin asking questions.

Executive positions up for election will be: President, Vice-President, Treasurer. Standing Committee positions will be: Fundraising, Membership, Publicity, Rhodofest.

Nominations must be submitted prior to the December 2008 AGM, and positions can be co-chaired by two individuals. With everyone's busy schedule these days, more and more positions are co-chaired which can make taking on a position less overwhelming. If you think you might want to take on a position, but are reluctant to take it on alone, take time over the upcoming months to discuss the option of co-chairing with a buddy. If you can't always make a meeting, but want to take on a role, co-chairing means less obligation as your position will always be covered.

Have a basic feel for numbers? Can you balance your chequebook? Perhaps the Treasurer position is the one for you. Interested in Publicity? Chat with Jackie and find out what she did 'behind the scenes' to make PR things happen for BRAGS. When you see your executive team sitting up at the front during each meeting, pay attention to the role they play...there might be one for you!

New to the club? All positions are strongly supported by other members, so jump in and get your feet wet! You will never be left alone to do the job.

Over the upcoming months, your Nominations team will be providing you with more information, and will of course, be available to answer your questions. Please don't be shy! A club like BRAGS doesn't happen without volunteers and members willing to step up and fill the roles we need. If you are interested in any of these positions right now, please speak to anyone of the executive team.

#### **President**

- The primary role of the President is to chair 10 meetings per annum, including the AGM. Involves preparing an agenda in advance, confirming with and allocating time for those committees which require floor time, reviewing correspondence received, communicating future relevant community events, and presenting requests for "Gifts to the Community" to the membership.
- Represents the Club at any required functions, or assigns a delegate.
- Provides support and guidance to the various committees and groups within BRAGS.
- Ensures the By-Laws of BRAGS are followed.

- Performs sundry duties such as picking up the Club's mail at Shadbolt and attending to any enquires by mail or by phone.
- Ensures the annual agreement is completed for the monthly meetings at Burnaby Village.

## Vice-President

- Fills in as President during any absences, and provides support as needed to the President and other Committee members.
- If necessary, assume the role of the President, should this role become unexpectedly vacant.

#### **Treasurer**

- Is responsible for the maintenance of all financial records of the club, keeping all accounting up to date and in order and available for audit.
- Issues cheques as needed for any dues, insurance, club expenses, disbursements or reimbursements to members for expenses incurred. Completes deposits for all funds received and issues receipts as required.
- Ensures the Society Annual Report form 11 is completed and forwarded to the Ministry of Finance within 30 days of the date of the AGM.

## **Publicity**

This position is ideal for someone who prefers to be "behind the scenes", as the majority of the duties can be performed by internet, phone or by mail. The primary function is to publicize BRAGS monthly meetings and special events such as the plant sale, garden tour, garden contest and RhodoFest (mostly handled by the City) in local newspapers, garden magazines, community newsletters and by networking with other garden clubs and garden columnists.

Solicit feature articles for print as necessary. Maintain and update a list of possible resources. Attend directors meetings. Provide reports at the monthly meetings as necessary. This is a 2 year term.

## **Fundraising**

This position is responsible for brain-storming and working with the various committees and executive to find ways to incorporate fundraising into our events. This role also works closely with the volunteer responsible for monthly draws.

Experience in soliciting funds from Corporate sponsors for major events such as the RhodoFest, could be an asset, but is not necessary. This position may also explore various options for future "Gifts to the Community", and make recommendations to the executive team, ensuring potential recipients meet the guidelines of the By- Laws. This position is easily shared between two members and is a 2 year term.

#### **RhodoFest Chair**

Calls and chairs all meetings of the RhodoFest Committee and combines efforts with the City of Burnaby staff responsible for the festival. Works with the City staff on development of advertising strategy and materials such as designing the poster and other advertising materials. Works with the Volunteer Co-Ordinator for: set up/take down, silent auction, parking attendants, truss display, and for volunteer t-shirts and other Festival details that may arise. This is a 2 year term.
